THE JAMES CURREY ARCHIVE

This collection was given to the Centre for African Literary Studies by JAMES CURREY and contains correspondence between African authors, readers and Heinemann publishers relating to two important series: the *African Writers Series* and *Heinemann Educational books*. These series published the works of emerging African authors after WW11 and especially after African countries became independent in the 1960s. Some literary giants of Africa started their literary careers within these two series and the correspondence surrounding their submission of manuscripts is extremely interesting.

The attached table, compiled in MS Word, is sorted alphabetically by author and reflects files of original correspondence held in the James Curry Archive at CALS. The collection is headed ALS 10, subdivided by Author, Box number and File number (divided by titles dealt with). The number of documents in each file is reflected on the table and the country of origin of the author. Wherever possible an article from Wikipedia or the Student Encyclopedia of African Literature has been printed and included in the file.
